Maryland Ranks Fourth for Rate of Prisoners Convicted as Children

During the previous legislative session, Maryland State senators brought forward a piece of legislation known as the Youth Equity and Safety Act (YES Act). The purpose of this bill was to end the automatic charging of juveniles as adults in the state of Maryland for some offenses. Unfortunately, the bill failed Maryland Senate. As if to illustrate the point that the bill made, a recent report indicated that Maryland has one of the highest rates of adult prisoners who were sentenced as children in the country. This report entitled "Crimes Against Humanity: The Mass Incarceration of Children in the United States" indicated that 1,132 prisoners in Maryland were incarcerated as children. This is 6% of the states prison population, twice the national average. Maryland is one of only nine states in the country with more than 1,000 prisoners sentenced as children.

This report argues that these numbers from Maryland represent the state's "tough-on-crime" sentencing policy that is in opposition to the current rehabilitationfocused juvenile justice system. But even with this updated perspective in the Maryland juvenile justice system, it is impossible to ignore the racial element of the reality that is charging children as adults. 90% of people who were sentenced as children were people of color (81.3% Black and 5.3% Hispanic). The average length of these sentences for these children was over 25 years.

Maryland Cannabis Possession & Use: What You Need to Know

- · Adults are legally permitted to possess up to 1.5oz. of cannabis.
- Cannabis use in a motor vehicle is illegal under Maryland law. Officers may make DUI arrest if they observe impairment
- Adults may grow up to 2 cannabis plants in their homes for personal use.
- It is still a crime to drive under the influence of a controlled substance.
- Possession with intent to distribute is STILL a felony.
- Interstate transport is STILL illegal under federal law.
